



Jack D. Sickmann

April 1, 1927 - August 27, 2007

RICHMOND, Ind. – Jack D. Sickmann, age 80, of Richmond, passed away Monday, August 27, 2007, at Reid Hospital. He was born April 1, 1927, in Richmond to Howard J. and Miriam Little Sickmann and was a lifelong resident of the community. Jack joined the Navy in 1944 at age 17 and served in World War II. He earned the remainder of his high school credits while in the service and received his high school diploma in 1945 from Richmond High School. After two years in the Navy he attended Purdue University. He and his wife, Virginia, were married July 19, 1947, and celebrated their 60th anniversary with their family and friends. Jack was employed at Swayne, Robinson & Co. in 1949 as a general foreman, became plant manager in 1956 and eventually became vice president in charge of manufacturing in 1965. He was a lifelong member of First English Lutheran Church. He served as the director of the Indiana Chapter, American Foundryman's Society and was also active in the Boy Scouts of America. He will be greatly missed by his wife, Virginia; two sons, Michael and wife Patricia and Steven, both of Richmond; five grandchildren; one great-grandchild; his brother, Robert Sickmann of Richmond; and three nieces. He was preceded in death by his parents. Funeral service for Jack D. Sickmann will be at 10 a.m. Thursday, August 30, 2007, at First English Lutheran Church with Pastor John Walker and Pastor Brian Derrer officiating. Burial will be in Lutherania Cemetery.
